A NEW BRAND HELPS US RECLAIM OUR POSITION IN THE MARKETPLACE

2023 marked a year of amazing transformation for the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago. From deepening our commitment to impact to connecting with new community partners, our new brand — the Power of Play — is at the center of everything that we do.

We launched our brand in October, following a multi-year process that included multiple rounds of stakeholder interviews, intensive evaluation of programs and services, and assessment of community and partner needs. In addition to showcasing the Y's purposeful commitment to progress and joy, the resulting brand reflects the Y's unique position and purpose as a vital community resource for individuals and families throughout Chicagoland and across the Midwest.

"Play is beneficial for people of all ages, and the Y's capacity to empower play for all members of our communities aligns closely with our mission to strengthen those communities by connecting all people to their purpose, potential, and each other," said Dorri McWhorter, President & CEO, YMCA of Metro Chicago.

Scientific research demonstrates correlation between playfulness and the ability for individuals to experience contentment, practice emotional intelligence, and cope with stressful situations, among other benefits. In youth, short breaks for play and leisure translate to significant increases in learning and academic performance. In adults, play has been shown to correlate with intrinsic motivation, creativity, spontaneity, and leadership.

"More than just colors and slogans, a brand represents an organization's identity, aspirations, and values, which for the Y include progress, growth, and — yes! — playfulness," said Brandon Davis, Vice President of Brand Engagement, YMCA of Metro Chicago. "The debut of 'The Power of Play' reflects not only the Y's commitment to the communities we serve, but also our organizational agility and expertise in leveraging that commitment to meet the needs of our members, partners, friends, and communities in an ever-evolving marketplace."

The YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago celebrated 165 years of impact at our 10th Annual Recognition Dinner in October 2023. Every year, the Y brings together the business, civic, and philanthropic leaders who are championing the Y's mission of strengthening community by connecting all people to their purpose, potential and each other.

In line with our newly unveiled brand platform, "The Power of Play," the theme for the 2023 Recognition Dinner was Play On! And play on we did!

During the reception, guests enjoyed interactive art, PLINKO, music, appetizers, and more. Y Board member Judith Toland and Board Chair Steve Sorensen served as the evening's emcees and kicked off the formal

program by welcoming guests to the event, recognizing Y leaders and staff, and celebrating the Y's role as a vital community asset for Chicagoland and the Midwest.

YMCA of Metro Chicago President and CEO Dorri McWhorter took the podium to share some past, current, and upcoming Y milestones, including the organization's role in establishing the Chicago Marathon in 1976, participation in the Sankofa Wellness Village, and announcement of a forthcoming Loop YMCA. Following dinner, the emcees announced the evening's raffle winners and introduced a video capturing just a sliver of the Y's impact over the past 165 years.

Y staff members Neisy Schultz, Vice President, Community Innovation and Impact, and Adrienne Johnson, Executive Director of Youth Safety and Violence Prevention, called for donations and, in line

with the impact video, highlighted some of the ways that donors' contributions can change the lives of the individuals, families, and communities served by the Y.

After presentation of their respective awards, honoree Jessica Sarowitz and honoree representatives Matt Knott of Builders Vision and Jourdan Sorrell of Comcast, sat down with McWhorter for a "campfire-side chat" about philanthropy, community engagement, and corporate social responsibility. Their stories and insights served as a source of inspiration for all attendees, reminding us of the power

we all have to make a difference in the lives of others. At the conclusion of the event, McWhorter teed up the world premiere of the Y's new brand video, The Power of Play!

Since 2014, the event has raised nearly \$10 million to power the Y's important work across the region, strengthening Chicagoland and the Midwest through play. ALL IN ON WORLD-CLASS HEALTH AND WELLBEING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ANYONE, ANYWHERE

NOW WITH PELOTON

No matter where you are in your fitness journey, the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago is here to support and empower you — and in 2023, we teamed up with Peloton to help our community members reach their goals!

Peloton and the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago partnered to advance community health and wellbeing, increase member and community access to best-in-class fitness programming, and close racial health and opportunity gaps across communities.

In addition to designated spaces for Y members to try free workouts on the Peloton App at the Lake View YMCA, four YMCA of Metro Chicago locations were outfitted with a total of 12 Peloton Bikes situated in specially designed, co-branded, experiential spaces. Fry Family YMCA in the western suburbs, McCormick YMCA in Chicago's Humboldt Park neighborhood, Sage YMCA in the northwest suburbs, and South Side YMCA in Chicago's Woodlawn neighborhood were strategically chosen as pilot locations for their geographic and demographic diversity and opportunity for community impact.

Plus, in celebration of our partnership, Peloton and the Y hosted a special Adult Day Camp at the McCormick YMCA, a day of fitness, food and festivity! In addition to Day-Camp-style activities such as tie-dye and bracelet-making, attendees participated in a morning stretch and run/walk led by Peloton Instructor Ash Pryor, along with a HIIT session led by YMCA of Metro Chicago team member Becky Neal. During lunch, guests heard from Pryor, McWhorter, and others about the importance of accessibility to health and fitness resources for all communities.

"Both the Y and Peloton are known industry leaders in strengthening our communities' holistic wellbeing and in working to break down barriers — real or perceived — that members of our communities face in the health, fitness, and lifestyle spaces," said Dorri McWhorter, President & CEO, YMCA of Metro Chicago. "Through this partnership, we're going to demonstrate that world-class health and wellbeing opportunities can truly be, in the words of Peloton, 'for anyone, anywhere.'"

ALL IN ON A RECLAIMED LEGACY OF ECONOMIC EQUITY WORK

FOR MORE THAN 165 YEARS, THE Y HAS BEEN A LEADER IN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Since our founding in 1858, the YMCA of Metro Chicago has worked to connect our friends, neighbors, and community members with jobs and career-exploration opportunities.

The Y's participation in a pilot program in 2023 and our continued efforts into 2024 (more on that in a moment!) represent our renewed commitment to this 165+ year-old priority.

The ComEd CONSTRUCT Youth Academy is a unique program designed to foster interest in a range of clean energy jobs that will be important for the future. Twenty high school students of color from the Chicago area spent several weeks in the summer of 2023 discovering career possibilities within the energy industry.

Building on ComEd's longstanding CONSTRUCT Infrastructure Academy for adults, ComEd and the Y launched the CONSTRUCT Youth Academy to get area youth interested at younger ages about job opportunities that are fast approaching due to a clean energy transition in Illinois. A recent study estimates that as many as 150,000 new clean energy jobs will be created in the state by 2050!

During the program, students received instruction and demonstrations from ComEd and YMCA leaders on a variety of relevant areas, including drone operation, power grid maintenance, work to support the growth of solar development, EVs, and more. At the completion of the program, students received a stipend of \$350 – an added benefit designed to

break down some of the financial barriers that could prevent some from participating.

"Through the first-ever CONSTRUCT Youth Academy program, our students have been able to plant seeds that will help them grow lifelong opportunities and strong roots for the future," said Dorri McWhorter, President and CEO of the YMCA. "Professionals in the energy, utility, construction, and facilities-management sectors will only continue to be in greater and greater demand in Illinois, and having this experience under their belts will position them for success, no matter which career path they choose after high school."

In 2024, the Y will be expanding the Youth CONSTRUCT program to train up to 70 students, and we're spearheading even more workforce opportunity through the Illinois Works Pre-Apprenticeship Program. In partnership with the State of Illinois, the Y has established four pre-apprenticeship cohorts for 2024 that include classroom training in core construction curriculum, hands-on learning at construction sites, and a stipend for successful completion of the program, as well as a range of supports to help participants transition into apprenticeship programs. These programs are part of the YMCA's Economic Equity Institute, which will focus on workforce development, financial investment and education, and home ownership.





ALL IN AS WE WORK TO ESTABLISH A PRESENCE IN EVERY COMMUNITY

FOR THE FIRST TIME IN MORE THAN A DECADE, THE Y ANNOUNCES PLANS FOR THREE NEW OR REOPENED COMMUNITY HUBS

In early 2023, the YMCA of Metro Chicago was overjoyed to learn that the Pritzker Traubert Foundation had awarded The Chicago Prize to the Sankofa Wellness Village! The Y is honored to be a part of this collaborative, community-led initiative that will create trusted, safe, comfortable, culturally empowering spaces and services in the West Garfield Park neighborhood.

With this major capital investment, we expect to open the doors of the West Garfield Park YMCA in 2025. Upon completion, the Wellness Village and the Y will include primary care, drop-in childcare, youth enrichment, fitness programming, mental health services, workforce development, a business incubator, a community-led credit union, and a community-owned grocery store. These services, spaces, and more will be primarily housed in a 60,000 square foot facility that will serve tens of thousands of community members annually.

The Y also announced in 2023 that our organization would be a major partner in the Assemble Chicago development in Chicago's Loop neighborhood. Assemble Chicago is a proposed mixed-use development in the heart of downtown Chicago that will also provide apartments affordable to a range of incomes, a wellness clinic, and a restaurant opening onto a revitalized Pritzker Park.

In addition to serving as an anchor for Assemble

Chicago, the Loop YMCA will re-establish the YMCA of Metro Chicago's community presence in the city's downtown area. Because of the central location and public-transit proximity, the Loop Y will serve and be accessible to a wide range of individuals, families, and groups, including business commuters, students, youth, visitors to Chicago, nearby residents, and more.

Following the Y's mobilization to open the doors of our former High Ridge YMCA to new Chicago arrivals, Y leaders and stakeholders worked on a plan to eventually reopen the High Ridge Y on a permanent basis. Major congressional support was secured for this initiative by Illinois Congresswoman Jan Schakowsky. The Y is committed to hosting our new neighbors for the duration of the ongoing humanitarian crisis. Once the High Ridge Y is no longer needed as a host site for this program, we will share our reopening plan.

The opening or reopening of these three sites demonstrates our commitment to serving more of Chicagoland's communities. We will increase our impact from serving 300,000 individuals annually to serving more than 1,000,000 individuals each year — and to establish a presence in each community area in Chicago and across the region.

ALL IN ON EMPLOYEE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

ESTABLISHING NEW ANNUAL TRADITIONS FOR THE CHICAGO PRIDE AND BUD BILLIKEN PARADES

Summer 2023 was a time of celebration and pride at the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago. Not only did we join the Bud Billiken Parade for the second year in a row, but the Y also participated in the Chicago Pride Parade for the first time ever!

We kicked off the season in June with more than 100 Y community members by traveling through the Northalsted, Lakeview, Uptown and Lincoln Park neighborhoods as part of the 52nd Annual Chicago Pride Parade. Along the route, we passed out Y swag, including YMCA-branded mini-basketballs and fans to beat the heat! Plus, to celebrate Pride Month, we released limited-edition YMCA Pride merch worn by our Y friends and family during the parade.

“As a proud member of the LGBTQ+ community and a Y employee for 18 years, I was grateful to take part in the Chicago Pride Parade and march with my fellow Y team members,” said Danielle Carey, Manager – Interviewing, Talent Acquisition, at the Y. “It was an incredibly inspiring celebration of strength, resiliency, and love with our communities and allies. Through my engagement with the Y’s LGBTQ+ Employee Resource Group, I’m hopeful that we can create a more inclusive and compassionate community for those we work with and serve.”



Although the Chicago Pride Parade was hit with rain showers, hundreds of thousands came out to show support for the LGBTQ+ community at the largest Pride event in the Midwest region and one of the most well-known commemorations of LGBTQ+ history and pride in the United States. The YMCA of Metro Chicago was incredibly proud to be a part of this event, showcasing our commitment to connecting all people — including our family, friends, and neighbors in the LGBTQ+ community — to their purpose, potential, and each other.

The Y carried our joyful energy through a wonderful summer of camps, new community partnerships, and so much more. Then in August, we kicked off the back-to-school season by celebrating Black excellence at the 94th Annual Bud Billiken Parade!

We had a fantastic time participating in the largest African American parade in the country, joined by our partners from Wilson and Target. As we traveled down the parade route, our Y community members, wearing limited-edition Bud Billiken Parade YMCA t-shirts, handed out slap bracelets, mini basketballs, and delicious treats.

The Y also hosted a booth at the post-parade festival in

Washington Park, where we connected with our community and shared swag, sports drinks (it was a hot one that day!), and information about the South Side YMCA’s programs and fall events.

“It’s always such a pleasure to be surrounded by members of our community as we celebrate education, joy, and health and wellbeing at ‘the Bud,’” said Jarquetta Egeston, Executive Director of the South Side YMCA. “Bud Billiken is an event and partnership that our staff, members, and communities treasure, and we look forward to participating again for many years to come!”

Here at the Y, we are so grateful to have had a sunny (metaphorically and literally!) summer of celebration. Together, we expressed our dedication to improving all communities, showcasing our commitment to inspiring change through the Power of Play, while bringing joy to those around us!

TEAM Y'S PRESENCE AT THE 2023 BANK OF AMERICA CHICAGO MARATHON



Here at the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago, we know all about the hard work and perseverance it takes to run a marathon — it's the kind of drive that truly exemplifies the Y spirit.

We had an amazing showing at the 2023 Bank of America Chicago Marathon, and it's all due to the 18 individuals who ran for Team YMCA (including several staff members!) and our dedicated supporters!

Thanks to the collective efforts of our Y community, we raised more than \$42,000, exceeding our initial goal of \$30,900!

"Running the Bank of America Chicago Marathon has been a lifelong dream, and Team YMCA opened the door of opportunity for me!" said Michael Crino, who competed in the marathon on behalf of Team Y this year. "I was part of an amazing, supportive training team and felt physically and emotionally ready for marathon day. No other charity organization in Chicagoland has the reach that the YMCA has, and I was so proud to raise awareness for the Y's programs that work with youth who have experienced gun violence. I am now a Marathon finisher!"

The Y extends our deepest gratitude to each and every supporter who contributed to this

success — whether through volunteering, donating, fundraising, or cheering from the sidelines.

While the 2023 Chicago Marathon was the second year in a row that the YMCA of Metro Chicago served as an official Charity Partner, our history is intertwined with the event's origin. In 1976, a small group of running enthusiasts met at the Central YMCA on LaSalle Street to plan the first modern marathon in the City of Chicago, leading to the first Chicago Marathon on September 25, 1977.

Now, nearly half a century later, the Y is grateful to continue being a part of the Chicago Marathon. In 2024, we'll be participating in the Bank of America Chicago Marathon once again — this time with 40 registered runners — and we can't wait to meet our community out on the marathon route once again!

ALL IN ALONGSIDE OUR PARTNERS AND SUPPORTERS

CHAMPIONS OF VOLUNTEERISM IGNITE CHANGE

At the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago, we are incredibly grateful to the work and commitment of our partners and volunteers, who dedicate their time and talents to bettering Chicagoland and the Midwest!

In 2023, the YMCA of Metro Chicago was visited by 16 different corporate volunteer groups who empowered us to provide critical services to our community, from distributing food to creating a welcoming environment for those we serve.

Among the amazing groups who joined us at the Y was the Blue Cross Blue Shield Association (BCBSA), who extended their support and partnership with the Y on their Community Impact Day in October to update and beautify YMCA spaces. More than 100 employee volunteers participated across three YMCA locations — North Lawndale YMCA in Homan Square, Rauner Family YMCA in Little Village, and South Side YMCA in Woodlawn.

Volunteers spent the morning and early afternoon helping beautify and organize the YMCAs' indoor and outdoor spaces. This included painting walls, landscaping, and gardening. After a day of hard work and community engagement, volunteers and Y leaders regrouped for a "closing circle" to share

the impact of volunteer support, both on the Y and BCBSA employees! Following their volunteer work, BCBSA made a special contribution of \$10,000 to the YMCA of Metro Chicago.

In November, BMO sent a team of their executives to volunteer at the Crown Family YMCA as part of the organization's Afternoon of Service. The nearly 25 volunteers assisted in preparing classroom spaces in advance of our re-opening of the Early Learning Demonstration Center (ELDC), helping set up the ELDC childcare team for success! BMO is a longtime partner and supporter of the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago, having sponsored the creation of the Collaboration & Innovation Center on the Crown Family Y's seventh floor.

We'd like to additionally extend special thanks to the employees and leadership teams of the McDonald's Corporation, CNA, Sam's Club, the University of Chicago Medical Center, Lotis Blue Consulting, Cushman & Wakefield, and Salesforce. Their steadfast belief in the Y's mission is an inspiring force as we work hard to champion the Power of Play and shape the YMCA of Metro Chicago into a connector and catalyst for our communities.
